What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the Simplicity NZ Share Fund (NZ Share Fund) has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. Simplicity NZ Limited prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

Description of this fund

The NZ Share Fund invests in securities listed on the New Zealand stock exchange (NZX), designed to be the New Zealand share component of a diversified investment portfolio.

Risk indicator


Small differences in fees and charges can have a big impact on your investment over the long term.

Ben had \$10,000 in the fund when the fund started on 3 April 2018 and did not make any further contributions. At 31 December 2018, Ben received a return after fund charges were deducted of \$635 (that is 6.35% of his initial \$10,000). Ben also paid \$22.50 in other charges. This gives Ben a total return after tax of \$612.50 for the period.
